Eva Grayzel, a nationally recognized master storyteller and performance artist, was diagnosed at age 33 with stage IV oral cancer and given a 15% chance of survival. After regaining her deep vibrant voice, Eva applied her stage skills to communicate the depth of her experience in a unique and powerful way. In 2013, she performed 'Tongue-Tied: A Story NOT Silenced by Oral Cancer' Off-Broadway in New York City to a sold-out audience. A champion for early detection, Eva founded the Six-Step Screening™ oral cancer awareness campaign. She is the author of Mr. C Plays Hide and Seek and Mr. C the Globetrotter.
